

Dear Beloved Parishioners of Holy Cross,

In Sunday's Gospel, Jesus shares a powerful parable about two men who went to the Temple to pray: a Pharisee, confident in his own righteousness, and a tax collector, humbly aware of his need for God's mercy.

The Pharisee's prayer was full of self-praise. He looked down on others while listing his virtues. The tax collector, however, stood at a distance, bowed in humility, and simply said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." Jesus tells us that it was the tax collector—not the Pharisee—who went home justified.

This parable challenges each of us to examine our own hearts. Do we approach God with a sense of superiority, or with humble trust? True prayer begins not with what we have done for God, but with what we need
