Catholic FAITH [part 7] – Fr Antony

For this week's Catechism, please read numbers 50-53 in the Catechism of the Catholic Church. You can find the text here: https://www.vatican.va/archive/ENG0015/ PF.HTM. Please discuss these reflection and questions in your families.

The Transmission of Divine Revelation [CCC 74 to 95]

God wants everyone to know and be saved through Jesus Christ. This message was first communicated through the apostles, who preached the Gospel Jesus taught. The apostles passed on their authority to their successors, the bishops, ensuring this message would be preserved for all time. This living transmission of God's Word is called Tradition [with a capital 'T'].

Tradition exists alongside Sacred Scripture (the Bible), both drawing from the same source – God. The Church, guided by the Holy Spirit, helps us interpret and understand both Scripture and Tradition. However, this authority, known as the Magisterium, doesn't create new teachings but faithfully protects what Jesus revealed.

Reflection:

- How does knowing that God wants me to be saved make me feel?
- Can you think of times when you experienced Tradition outside of just reading the Bible? (Examples: praying the Rosary, the Stations of the Cross, parish missions, etc.)

Questions to Discuss:

- What's the difference between Tradition and traditions?
- Why is it important for the Church to have a teaching authority (the Magisterium)?
 - How can we grow in our understanding of our faith?

Verses to Remember:

"He who hears you hears me" - Luke 10:16
"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations..." - Matthew 28:19


